DUBAI: The Emirates Scuba and Skin Diving Club is back in action this month and welcoming new members, including complete beginners. The club plans to host a number of PADI Open Water Diver courses, the first level of diving certification. Each course consists of five confined water (pool) dives and four open water (sea) dives.

Andrew Jones, Club President, said: "I'll run the pool dives and the first two beach dives from Dubai. The two boat dives can then be done locally or on the east coast in Fujairah. The course will cost Dhs2,100, which includes all the diving, course material, training for three days, equipment hire, boat fees, student training insurance and of course the PADI certification card upon completion. We welcome beginners and encourage their friends to join them, as dives are always more fun with a group."

What you will learn:

The PADI Open Water Diver course is the most popular and widely recognised qualification for learning how to dive. Those completing this course will be qualified to dive with a buddy up to a maximum depth of 18m (60 feet).

The course consists of three modules:

Knowledge Development: This is where you will learn the basic principles of scuba diving. Confined Water Dives: This is where you learn basic scuba diving skills and try breath-

ing underwater for the first time. These are

conducted in a pool. Open Water Dives: Test your knowledge and confined water experience in the open water. After four open water dives, you will be awarded your PADI Open Water Diver certification.

Several courses will be held between January and March. The final dates will be set once sufficient numbers have committed to each dive course.
